What can parents do?

- Provide a safe working space/environment
- Treat online learning similar to that of school - e.g., at table, dressed, materials needed
- Contact therapists via email if concerns
- Remind your son/daughter of the online contract
- Encourage completion of assignments
- Check online classrooms for new activities
- Reduce distractions-extraneous noise/visual
- Use of headphones, mute, camera
